HUNTER CLASSES: Hunter sections will be judged on performance and soundness. Manners shall be emphasized and extreme speed penalized in all classes. Horses will not be jogged for soundness. Management reserves the right to combine or cancel any divisions with insufficient entries.

EQUITATION CLASSES: Riders may only ride one horse in an equitation class. To be judged on general horsemanship.

CROSS RAIL: Judged on suitability. No in and outs.

WALK TROT: Judged on suitability. No in and outs. Will be judged down for cantering the courses.

ATTIRE: Riders are required to wear approved protective head gear, riding boots and britches or jodpurs.

BRAIDING: PLEASE, Do Not Braid for this horse show. Horses/ponies will not be penalized for being braided.

SAHJA Pony Medal A Hunt Seat medal open to junior riders showing ponies (14.2 hands and under). The SAHJA Pony Medal shall be judged over a course of fences 2'3" in height, with two USEF tests (1-9) incorporated into the course. Jumper type equipment is not allowed. Any additional workoff shall be at the judge's discretion.

SAHJA Mini Medal A Hunt Seat medal open to any junior or adult amateur rider who has not won a 3'6" USEF-rated medal class or any medal finals, except the SAHJA Pony Medal. Riders will be judged over a course of fences 2'6" in height, with at least two USEF tests (1-9) incorporated into the course. Jumper type equipment is not allowed. No work-offs are allowed.

SAHJA Child/Adult Medal A Hunt Seat medal open to any junior or adult amateur rider who has not won a 3'6" USEF-rated medal finals. Riders to be judged over a course of fences 3'0" in height. Jumper type equipment is not allowed. At least the top four riders will return for a flat work-off.

Madden Medal Open to Jr/Am not showing over 18" at this show. Trotting and/or cantering allowed. Riders will show over a course of 8 fences and be judged on their equitation. Any additional testing is at the judges' discretion. All ribbon winners will be qualified for the Medal Finals.

EQUINE HEALTH ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

SAHJA ONLY

ONSITE VETERINARY OR THEIR TECHNICIAN EXAMINATION OF ALL HORSES FOR VESICULAR LESIONS AT TIME OF ENTRY TO MURIETA EQUESTRIAN CENTER. NO HORSE WILL BE PERMITTED ENTRY TO STABLING, SCHOOLING OR COMPETITION AREA WITHOUT VETERINARY EXAMINATION.

REJECTION OF ANY HORSE OR LOAD OF HORSES WITH SUSPECT LESIONS.

HEALTH DECLARATION – REQUIRED

Signed by the RESPONSIBLE PERSON verifying that the horse has been healthy with no sign of vesicular stomatitis or any other infectious disease and has not had a fever above 101.5 °F within 72 hours (3 days) of arrival.

Required for all horses entering Murieta Equestrian Center both Showing and Non-Showing.

PROOF OF VACCINATION – REQUIRED

Signed statement from the attending veterinarian that the horse has been vaccinated against the following.

Within 6 months (180 days) of each show: Equine Influenza (EIV)

Within 6 months (180 days) of each show: Rhinopneumonitis (EHV 1 and EHV 4)

If a vaccination will expire during one of the shows, the horse must receive its new vaccination prior to being issued a competition number for the show.

PRESENTATION OF HEALTH REQUIREMENTS

The Equine Health Requirements are Required for all horses entering Murieta Equestrian Center grounds both Showing and Non-Showing. These documents must be filed in the Show Office before any competition numbers will be issued. All required papers must indicate the horse's registered (show) name.

All horses permanently stabled at Murieta Equestrian Center and showing at the HMI shows must meet these Health Requirements.

Any horse not accompanied by these documents will be directed to the Show Veterinarian to obtain the required documents and/or vaccinations, and/or will be placed in quarantined stabling until proper documents are obtained. Any horse showing signs or fever/illness/stress is subject to examination by HMI Officials and/or the Show Veterinarian.

GR844 Equine Vaccination Rule

1. At Federation licensed competitions, horses entering the grounds must be accompanied by documentation of Equine Influenza Virus and Equine Herpes Virus (Rhinopneumonitis) vaccinations within six months prior to entering the stables. Horses not in compliance with this rule may be required to leave the competition grounds upon request by Competition Management. Documentation should consist of one of the following methods mentioned below. The frequency of vaccine administration should be per the vaccine manufacturers' or veterinarian's recommendations. It is recommended that vaccines are administered by or under the direction of a veterinarian.
2. In the case of vaccines administered by a veterinarian, the exhibitor, upon request by Competition Management, must provide documentation from the veterinarian on documenting that the horse in question received the vaccinations; name of the vaccines and date of vaccine administration.
3. In the case of vaccines administered by a person other than a veterinarian, the exhibitor, upon request by Competition Management, must provide a receipt of the vaccine purchase which is signed by the owner, or agent with care, custody, and control of the horse; name, serial number and expiration date of the vaccine; and date of vaccine administration.
4. In the case of a horse that is unable to receive either of the vaccinations due to a history of adverse reactions, the exhibitor, upon request by Competition Management, must provide a letter from the veterinarian on official letter-head stating that the horse in question cannot be vaccinated due to medical concerns and a log of temperatures taken twice daily for the seven days prior to entering the competition grounds. These horses must also have their temperature taken and logged twice daily while on the competition grounds. The log of temperatures should be provided to the Competition Management, steward, or technical delegate when requested.

3 DAY TEMPERATURE LOG

****MUST BE SUBMITTED UPON ARRIVAL****

A 3 day temperature log, with temperatures taken twice per day will be required upon arrival. You must present this paperwork filled out at the Check In Gate in order to enter the grounds. Failure to present the Temperature log will result in denied access to the grounds.

I declare that the temperatures listed above are accurate recordings.

Due to the severity of the EHV-1 cases that are currently in California, the paperwork that will be required to bring a horse to the Murieta Equestrian Center showgrounds will be considered truthful and factual. In the event of any of these protocols being ignored, we will refuse further entries from all related horses and we will inform USEF for further disciplinary action. Noncompliance with these protocols will result in penalties imposed by USEF on trainers and owners as well as competitions that knowingly permit non-compliant horses on the showgrounds. A breach of this and you and your horses will be asked to leave the showgrounds.

RULES AND GENERAL INFORMATION

1. RELEASES

MURIETA EQUESTRIAN CENTER: I HEREBY EXPRESSLY, VOLUNTARILY, AND UNCONDITIONALLY RELEASE, INDEMNIFY AND HOLD HARMLESS Murieta Equestrian Center, Sally Hudson and/or Headlands Management, Inc., their owners, officers, members, agents, employees, licensees and invitees, as well as any other person, firm, corporation, company, entity, or anyone in any way connected with the ownership and management of the show premises and the Horse Show, or in control of the premises or equipment related thereto (collectively, "Releasees") from and against ANY AND ALL CLAIMS FOR INJURIES, DAMAGES, AND/OR LOSSES connected with participation in this Horse Show. This includes, but is not limited to, claims for monetary damages, attorney's fees, costs, losses, and/or causes of action against Releasees for any and all Harm to me or my horse(s) and for any Harm caused or contributed in any way to by me or my horse(s) to others, arising out of or in any way connected with participation in this Horse Show, and includes reimbursement of Releasees' costs and attorney's fees incurred in defense of such claims. I further agree to this release, indemnification, and holding harmless WHETHER OR NOT SUCH CLAIM, INJURY, DAMAGE, OR LOSS RESULTED, DIRECTLY OR INDIRECTLY, FROM MY NEGLIGENT ACTS OR OMISSIONS OR THE NEGLIGENT ACTS OR OMISSIONS OF RELEASEES, to the fullest extent allowed by law. I also acknowledge that no representations or warranties, whether oral or written, implied or expressed, have been made by Releasees concerning the Horse Show premises, the Horse Show event, or the activities at Murieta Equestrian Center or any other matter.

2. MANAGEMENT: The Horse Show Manager reserves the right to itself to interpret all questions and conditions in regard to, or arising out of, or incident to the show without claims for damages or recourse of any kind. All questions not covered in these Rules and Regulations shall be decided by the horse show manager; its decision to be final.

3. RESPONSIBILITY: The Horse Show Manager reserves to itself the right to refuse, accept conditionally, or to cancel any entries, disqualify any riders or exhibitors, prohibit exhibition of entries, and cancel award prizes, without claim for damages; to change any course, to cancel or combine any unfilled classes, or to reschedule classes as competition warrants.

4. CONDITION OF ENTRY: Every horse entered herein for competition will be under the control of the Horse Show Manager, but the horse show manager will in no case be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur, and it shall be a condition of entry that each exhibitor shall hold the individual horse shows and the officials, employees, directors, officers, sponsoring entities, Murieta Equestrian Center, Headlands Management, Inc. and its employees, directors, officers, sponsoring entities of each horse show and the facilities at which each horse show is held blameless for any loss or accident to his horse(s), employee(s), or equipment which may occur from sickness, fire or other cause. All owners and exhibitors shall be responsible for any damage incurred by them, their agents or employees to stalls, buildings, and other properties on the show grounds, and shall be billed accordingly.

5. STALL REQUEST: Trainers will be responsible for payment of all stalls requested. Check or Credit Card required to hold stalls. If stall request are taken, they will only be held until the close of entries.

6. ENTRY PROCEDURES: Entry blanks must be filled out completely, including all classes entered, signatures and organizational membership numbers. Horses entered without classes may be put on

a waiting list for classes if rings are fully subscribed. Entry blanks must be postmarked or submitted electronically (showgroudslive.com/headlands or Equestrian Connect) on or before the closing date of entries. Any entry postmarked or entered online after the closing date of entries may be charged a late fee. Late fee is \$50. For each horse entered, send in the \$125 nominating fee and all stall fees (if a stall is needed).

7. NOMINATING/OFFICE FEE: The Nominating/Office fee will not be deducted from the entry fees. Classes scratched in the Horse Show Office on the official add/scratch forms before the start of the class will receive a full refund. Scratch fees may still apply.

8. POST ENTRIES/SCRATCH FEES: Any entry postmarked after the close of entries is considered a post entry and will pay a \$50 late fee as penalty. Classes may be added up until 4:00 pm the day prior to the day of the class. A full class fee refund will be given to all classes scratched prior to the start of the class (exception – Special classes. See Rules 34 & 35). Horse Show Management reserves the right to limit entries at its discretion.

9. ENTRY BLANKS: Care should be taken to enter each horse in its proper division or class. Exhibitors are responsible for their errors and those of their agents in making out entry blanks. In all cases the description on the entry blank must fully identify the horse. The word “entry” shall not be accepted.

- A. Be properly signed, and in the case of a minor, be signed by a parent or guardian.
- B. Be made on an entry blank provided by the show.
- C. Show the correct mailing address of the owner.
- D. Social Security number must be included on entry blank.

10. REFUNDS: All refund requests must be submitted in writing.

- A. Before close of entries all fees will be refunded.
After the closing date of entries, no refunds will be given unless you meet one of the following requirements:
 - > Prior to start of show, entry fees will be refunded less the stall fee and office fee.
 - > After the show starts, classes that are scratched in the Horse Show Office before the class has started will be refunded.
 - > After the show starts, add and scratch fees for Classics, Grand Prix, Stakes and Special Classes will apply.

11. RETURNED CHECKS: Checks returned by the bank for any reason are regarded as a most serious offense and will be handled in the following procedure. \$50 OR 10% OF THE AMOUNT OF THE CHECK WILL BE ASSESSED FOR EACH RETURNED CHECK!! Accounts will be given ten days to be paid in full with cash, or cash equivalent or they will be turned into USEF and PCHA for further disciplinary action. Credit Cards declined and chargebacks will be handled as above.

12. UNPAID CHARGES: Any outstanding charges for entries (showing and non-showing horses) stalls, trainer accounts, trainer splits, RV's, VIP, farrier, veterinarian, feed supplier, photographer, food concessionaire, etc. may result in the exhibitor's entries not being accepted at a subsequent show. If the show management must bill an exhibitor for unpaid charges, a \$50 billing fee will be added to the amount due.

13. PRIZE MONEY: Prize money not deducted from the statement will be made payable to the owner listed on the entry blank and mailed within thirty days after the show. PRIZE MONEY WILL NOT BE MAILED UNLESS THE OWNER'S SOCIAL SECURITY NUMBER IS LISTED ON THE ENTRY BLANK AND A W-9 IS ON FILE WITH THE HORSE SHOW OFFICE. ANYONE REQUESTING 1099 CHANGES AFTER THEY HAVE BEEN MAILED WILL BE CHARGED \$100 TO BE PAID IN ADVANCE. PRIZE MONEY CHECKS NOT CASHED AFTER 90 DAYS WILL HAVE A STOP PAYMENT PLACED ON THEM AND THE EXHIBITOR WILL FORFEIT THE PRIZE MONEY.

PRIZE MONEY WON BY FOREIGN EXHIBITORS: Foreign exhibitors are advised that the U.S. Internal Revenue Service requires sporting events to withhold 30% of prize money won in the United States. Foreign exhibitors should apply for a U.S. Social Security number and will be asked to complete form W-8 prior to the Headlands Management, Inc. horse shows issuing prize money won.

14. CLOSE OUT: Entries not closed out by 10:00 AM on the Monday following the show may be charged a \$100 close-out fee.

15. ARRIVAL AND DEPARTURE: Horses and Grooms may arrive and depart within the days and hours listed below.

16. MOTORIZED VEHICLES: Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent(s), legal guardian(s), or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for sanctions against the parent(s), guardian(s) and/or trainer(s) who are responsible for the child committing the offense. Penalties may include exclusion of the child, parent(s), guardian(s), and/or trainer(s) from the competition grounds for the remainder of the competition and charges being filed against any of the above individuals in accordance with Chapter 6. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule. USEF GR1301.7.

The unsafe use of personal electronic transport devices, as determined by the competition officials and management in their sole discretion, that do not require a driver's license to operate, including but not limited to segways, hover boards, and single wheeled scooters is prohibited on competition grounds.

Operating such devices in areas where people gather may be deemed “unsafe use” if there is a risk of harm to others. If the operator of the device is a minor, the parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating the device in violation of this rule is accountable and may be subject to penalties. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule. USEF GR1301.8.

17. PARKING: Horse trailers will be parked in designated areas. Autos will be parked in designated areas. No autos in the barn isles.

18. RV's: RV parking is available at \$400 per RV per show. Includes either 50 amp or 30 amps of electricity and water. RV's must park in designated area with a dated permit provided by the show. Permit must be visibly placed in windshield. Reservations will be taken on a Paid first come-first served basis.

19. STABLING: Request for stalls for horses not entered in the show or for tack, feed or grooming may be reduced by management and refunds given, if there is a shortage of stalls. **NO STRAW ALLOWED.**

20. STALLS: Exhibitors are responsible for the condition of the stalls upon departure. Anyone dismantling stalls or causing damage to a stall will be charged a \$100 fee per panel, with a maximum fine per stall of \$400. Wood and canvas stalls are 10 x 10 with top & bottom doors. All stalls have dirt floors.

21. FEED AND BEDDING: All feed orders received in the Horse Show Office by NOON will be delivered the same day. Saturday feed orders must be in by NOON. No deliveries on Sundays. All feed orders must state barn and stall numbers. Feed and bedding will not be delivered without a signed open check or credit card # on file at the Horse Show Office.

22. MEDICAL WASTE: Needles must be placed in the proper receptacles. Anyone found in violation shall be subject to \$100 fine or other penalties deemed necessary by show management. USEF GR1210.4

23. NUMBERS: Management will provide a number card for each competitor which shall be worn on the rider's back for hunters and equitation and on the saddle pad for jumpers clearly visible to the judge at all times when in competition. Riders wearing the wrong number or no number at all may be eliminated from the class by the judge.

24. COURSES: Courses may consist of any combination of the following: Brush, Gate, Oxers, Panels, Post & Rails, Banks, Ditches, Coups & Liverpools. The horse show management reserves the right to adjust fence heights or spreads in jumper classes as competition warrants.

25. HARD HATS AND ATTIRE: USEF GR801 will be strictly enforced.

It is compulsory for all persons at Federation licensed hunter, jumper or hunter/jumper competitions when mounted anywhere on the competition grounds, to wear properly fastened protective headgear which meets or exceeds ASTM (American Society for Testing and Materials)/SEI (Safety Equipment Institute) standards for equestrian use and carries the SEI tag. It must be properly fitted with harness secured. GR801.2

All exhibitors are required to wear shoes or boots with a riding heels whenever mounted on horseback on the grounds. GR801.9

26. DOGS: Dogs are not permitted to be loose on competition grounds and must be held on a leash or otherwise restrained. Individuals must not lead dogs on a leash while mounted. Dog owners are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from their dogs' behaviors. Dog owners failing to comply with this rule will be issued a Yellow warning card may be subject to penalty under Chapter 7. See USEF GR1301.6

Loose dogs will be picked up and detained until the owner has paid a fine of \$50. A second offense may cause the owner to be barred from showing and expelled from the show grounds. Refusal to pay the fine will bar the owner from further participation in the horse show and the owner will not be entitled to any refund of entry or stabling fees paid or due. Management reserves the right to call Animal Control to have an animal removed from the premises.

27. TIME SCHEDULE/POSTED ORDER: Each evening the time schedule for the next day's schedule will be available. This time schedule will be strictly adhered to. The trainer, exhibitor or other representative must tell the paddock steward of possible ring conflicts so that arrangements can be made to accommodate the rider as well as the time schedule. All Hunter and Jumper orders will be drawn according to USEF Rule JP112. Posted orders for Grand Prix, Hunter and Jumper Classics and Hunter and Jumper Derbies will be strictly adhered to. All Horse Show Manager decisions will be final.

28. LUNGING: Lunging is NOT permitted in the following arenas: Grand Prix Arena, Grand Prix Warm-Up, Main Hunter Arena, Jumper 2 Arena, Hunter 2 Arena, Hunter 3 Arena or Hunter 4 Arena. The trainer will be fined \$100 each time anyone is caught lunging in any of these arenas. The \$100 penalty fee will be added to the trainer's show bill and is expected to be paid upon show check out.

29. ARENAS: GGT Footing Arena – Textile 121' x 255', The Classics Arena – Textile 100' x 200', JD Pasquetti Arena – Textile 180' x 240',
Premier Equine Arena – Textile 140' x 280', Murieta Inn & Spa Arena – Sand 148' x 300'
Lunging Arenas – Sand ~60 x 100 and ~150 x 250.
